


Term 1 welcome from Executive Director Andrew Smith



Learn the Alexander Technique at MitCon

Experience the benefits of the Alexander Technique at MitCon this term with qualified teacher Elissa Jones. Frederick Matthias Alexander (1869–1955) was a performing artist who developed the technique to continue to pursue his life's dream - performing Shakespeare. The Alexander Technique's hallmarks are its creativity, spontaneity, and adaptability to change.



MitCon offers you the opportunity to learn the Alexander Technique in three formats in 2025:

- private 45 minute lessons on Fridays;
- a small group hour-long class on Tuesdays from 11.30 to 12.30 (details tbc);
- two workshops on 22nd March and 21st June.

The workshops will be run by A.T. Out West, a collaboration between Elissa and two other Alexander Technique teachers based in Lithgow and Katoomba. The workshops will introduce you to Alexander Technique principles to reawaken the ability to walk well and to rekindle a desire to walk for wellness.
